Professional Summary:

I am a highly experienced and dedicated UK qualified GP with over 15 years of practice in the UK. Throughout my career, I have developed a strong foundation in General Practice, having worked as a GP Principal, Salaried GP, and Sessional GP. In addition to my regular clinical work, I have actively pursued locum posts to utilize my special interests in diabetes and weight management, frailty, urgent care, out of hours, and palliative medicine.

I was working in a secure environment, where I pursued Drug Rehabilitation RCGP Part 1. This qualification allows me to address drug dependence and decrease the reliance on medicines associated with drug addiction. It is my mission to improve the health outcomes of individuals facing these challenges.

One of the highlights of my career is my role at HMP Durham, where I cover 8 sessions and assess prison patients through reception, whether they are admitted from police cells or court. These patients often face complex health issues, including homelessness, withdrawal from street drugs, or chronic and acute mental illness. Collaborating closely with colleagues from various disciplines, I conduct clinics for patients with a wide range of chronic mental and physical health conditions.

During my tenure as the GP Clinical Lead at Ravenscar practice under Elm Alliance, I had the opportunity to shape disease management, Quality and Outcomes Framework (QOF), and risk management. Additionally, I provided support to my colleagues in the administration and nurse team, ensuring smooth operations and high-quality care delivery.

As the McMillan Lead for Hartlepool, I made significant contributions to cancer care. As a GP Clinical Supervisor in the out-of-hours setting, I take pride in facilitating and supporting the training and examination process of junior colleagues. Looking ahead, I am eager to explore new areas of practice, including research and involvement in clinical trials, to enhance the income of the practice and stay up to date with the latest clinical advancements.

Furthermore, I am actively involved in medical education, hosting medical students from the Medical School of Sunderland starting from Year 1. Through clinical skills training and exposure to patients during placements, I aim to nurture and develop the next generation of doctors. By promoting general practice as a rewarding career choice, we can create a strong foundation for future doctors to join our practice and contribute to the field.
